- USCG has been using the Incident Command System (ICS) for 15 years.
- In Deepwater Horizon response the fundamental concepts, processes, and organization structures of ICS were found to be effective and appropriate.





Major Gaps



- There are gaps in doctrine, training, tactics, and procedures that were highlighted during the response.
 - Training
 - Information management
 - Unified Area Command
 - Air space management
 - Branch level planning

- Area Command Guidance
- Revise the CG Incident Management Handbook
- Analyze and validate training methodology
- Certification of proficiency
