

- 'National Contingency Plan for Marine Pollution from Shipping and Offshore Installations' – covers oil and HNS






The UK Pollution Control Zone

This area includes the UK's internal waters, defined as waters inside the baseline of territorial waters, territorial seas, defined as 12 miles from the baseline; and the UK's pollution control zone, defined as 200 miles from the baseline or out to the nearest median line.

- Anticipated UK resource pool
- HNS Marine Response Level 1
 - Provision of appropriate advice
 - Chemical Manufacturer, Supplier, Shipper etc
 - Fire and Rescue Service



- Anticipated UK resource pool
- HNS Marine Response Level 2
 - As previous plus:
 - Recognised / accredited Level 2 response contractor
 - Maritime Incident Response Group



- Maritime Incident Response Group
 - Fire fighting at Sea
 - Will form an integral part of UK Search and Rescue
 - 15 Groups within the UK each with 50 trained staff



- Anticipated UK resource pool
- HNS Marine Response Level 3
 - As previous plus
 - MCA HNS Response Team
