MARINE POLLUTION CRISIS MANAGEMENT

AIMS

The purpose of this course is to inform participants of the spill risks associated with maritime activities and to train them in the collection of data relating to the spill, crisis management and response to the pollution at sea. It provides participants with practical, concrete knowledge of the dangers for humans and the environment of oil and chemicals released at sea, as well as the response organisation in the event of a spill at sea and the strategic, regulatory and technical aspects of spill response. By the end of the course, participants will be able to join a crisis command centre and contribute to contingency planning for aspects relating to response at sea.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Naval officers
Personnel involved in emergency crisis management both at sea and on land
Shipping personnel liable to be involved in managing a shipping accident

TOPICS COVERED

- Oil spill crisis management: methodology, role of departments/agencies, legal framework, liability and compensation aspects;
- Understanding pollution: behaviour of substances spilled at sea, slick detection, decision support systems;
- Response strategies and techniques: dispersion, containment, recovery, response to HNS spills.

These topics are illustrated with case studies.
The session is concluded with a 4-hour tabletop exercise.
