

Spills in ports in the limelight for a day

What should be done if a spill occurs in a port? How can we prepare for such incidents? Which products and techniques should be used? Which specific challenges do port stakeholders encounter? These questions and many more will be addressed during the Information Day organised by Cedre in Paris on 28th September.

Spills in ports, a common occurrence

While major oil spills are fortunately increasingly rare, spills in ports are a relatively common occurrence, which call for preparedness and foresight. Such spills may be due to a wide variety of causes: shipping incidents, bunkering operations, accidental bilge water discharge, failure of industrial facilities or port infrastructures, run-off from sewer systems or rainwater drainage pipes, containers falling overboard...

Speakers from a variety of backgrounds to address specific issues

The Cedre Information Day is an excellent opportunity to draw together State players and private companies to focus on a common concern: preparing for and handling spills in ports.

To illustrate the pollution issues relevant to each type of port in practical terms, specialists renowned in their field of expertise will be sharing their experience and engaging in discussions with the audience: Cedre, the French Maritime Affairs Directorate, the Port of Marseille, Dutch firm HEBO Maritiemservice, the International Tanker Owners Pollution Federation (ITOPF), Ports of Monaco and the Bas-Rhin fire department.

The Cedre Information Day was first launched in 1995, on the initiative of the Strategy Committee, the body which sets out the association's scientific and technical priorities. This event addresses a given technical focus from a variety of angles. Several internationally recognised experts in the field share their vision and experiences.
